AWARD OF THE AIR MEDAL FOR HEROISM

1. TC 320. The following AWARD is announced.

BUCKLEY, HARRY A. . LIEUTENANT COLONEL INFANTRY USA

HHC, 2nd Bn, 502nd Inf, 1st Bde, 101st Abn Div, APO 96347
Awarded: Air Medal with "V" Device Second Oak Leaf Cluster /

Date action: 22 June 1967 22 Theater: Republic of Viet Nam

Reason: For heroism in connection with military operations against a hostile force: Lieutenant Colonel Buckley distinguished himself by exceptionally valorous actions on 22 June 1967, hear Duc Pho, Republic of Viet Nam. While on a reconnaissance mission, Lieutenant Colonel Buckley, flying in the command and control helicopter, detected a group of people moving across an open area. He immediately directed the pilot of the helicopter to make a low pass over the area to determine if the people were friendly or enemy. As the helicopter passed over the area they were suddenly brought under heavy ground fire and received several hits. With complete disregard for his own safety, Lieutenant Colonel Buckley directed the helicopter pilot to make another low pass at the area in an attempt to locate the area where the enemy fire was coming from. As the helicopter passed over the area they were again fired upon. This time, Colonel Buckley directed the gunners to open fire and the enemy position was neutralized. Lieutenant Colonel Buckley's devotion to duty and personal courage were in keeping with
