## AWARD OF THE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS

MIDPHY, KENNETH E SERGEART 39 United States Arms Meadquarters and Headquarters Company, 20 Mattalian (Airborne), 5024 Infant Ty, Let Brigade, 181st Airborne Division, APO 96347

Awarded: Distinguished Service Cross

Date action: 9 November 1966 Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For extraordinary hereism in connection with willtary operations involving conflict with an armed hostile force in the Republic of Vietnam: Sergeant Hurphy distinguished bimself by exceptionally valorous actions on 9 November 1966 while serving as a Squad leader with a recently pictoon on a search and destroy mission near Try How. The unit had covered several thousand meters of terrain with degative results, until the point was finally care upon, and killed, a North Vietnemese soldier. The sporadic nostile fire was received from the left flath, Surpost Murphy immediately led his aquad in an assault on the insurgent positions.
