## AWARD OF THE SOLDIER'S MEDAL

1. TC 320. The following AWARD is announced.

BURKHALTER, EDGAR C JR Army Company A, 2d Battalion (Airborne), 502d Infantry, 1st Brigade, 101st Airborne Division, APO San Francisco 96347.

Awarded: Soldier's Medal Date action: 21 May 1967

Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: Heroism not involving actual conflict with an armed hostile force. Sergeant First Class Burkhalter distinguished himself by heroism not involving actual conflict with an armed hostile force on 21 May 1967 near Duc Pho, Republic of Vietnam, while serving as a member of Company A, 2d Battalion (Airborne), 502d Infantry, 1st Brigade, 101st Airborne Division. During a resupply mission one of the resupply helicopters crashed while attempting to take off and several mon were pinned under the wreckage. Sergeant Burkhalter, realizing the great danger of the aircraft catching fire with ammunition and explosives aboard, rushed to the aid of the stricken men. As Sergeant Burkhalter neared the wreckage, it started to smoke and then caught fire. With complete disregard for his personal safety and at the risk of his life, he moved to the tail assembly and by sheer strength lifted it and held it until the men were pulled free from the wreckage and to safety. Only then did he set the aircraft down and move away from the intense hoat. Had it not been for Sergeant Burkhalter's courage, two men would have burned to death. Sergeant Burkhalter's heroic actions were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and refloct great credit upon hinself, his unit, and the United States ATTEY .
