## AWARD OF THE SILVER STAR

1. TO 320. The following AWARD is announced.

LUME, HERRIK .. CAPTAIN INFARTHY United States Army Co A, 2d Bn (Abn), 502d Inf, 1st Bde, 101st Abn Div, APC US Forces 96347

Awarded: Silver Star (First Cak Leaf Cluster)

Date action: 9 February 1964 Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For gallantry in action: Captain Lunde distinguished himself en 9 February 1965 while serving as a company commander on a search and destroy mission near Thy Hos, Republic of Vietnam. When the load elements of the company approached the end of a marrow valley, they were engaged by an estimated Viet Cong company. During a hull in the action at wesk, Captain Lunde reorganized his forces and was leading them to a secured landing come to evacuate casualties when the lead platoon was viciously attacked by a Vist Cong force. Although Captain Lunde and his command group were pinned down in the open by a nurderous crossfire from two machine guns, Captain Lunde skillfully directed his executive efficer in the defense of the remainder of the company. When the small group received intense gremade and mortar fire, Captain Lunde fearlessly led a bold frontal assault on the Viet Cong positions. Inspired by his courage, the small force overran the hostile emplacements. When their new position received a crossfire from two Viet Cong machine gurs, he detected movement in the bushos. Captain Lunde, having used all of his grenades and not wanting to give away the exact location of his small perimeter, jumped up from his concealed position, and killed a Viet Cong with a burst of accurate fire. Captain funde's alertness and courageous action caved the small group from tertain disaster. Throughout the course of the battle, Captain Lunde displayed aggressiveness, outstanding leadership, and inspired his men by his example. His unimpeachable valor in close combat against a numerically -superior hostile force was in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflects great credit upon hirself, his unit, and the United States Army.
