AWARD OF THE SILVER STAR

1. TC 320. The following AWARD is amounced.

LUNDE, HENRIK O. CAPTAIN INFANTRY United States Army Co A, 2d En (Abn), 502d Inf, 1st Ede, 101st Abn Oiv, APO 96347

Awarded: Silver Star (First Oak Leaf Cluster)

Date action: Il May 1966 Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Heasin: For gallantry in action: Captain Lunde distinguished himself on 11 May 1766 while serving as commanding officer of a task force on a search and destroy operation near Bu Gla Map, Republic of Vietnam. While moving toward their objective, the lead elements received intense bostile five from a large Viet Cong force. After determining the main line of resistance, Captain Lunde moved to the front of his force to enable him to better direct their retallatory fire. Realizing that the insurgent positions overlapped has flanks, he committed a portion of his reserve force to the left flank. Although repeatedly exposed to intense hostile fire, he moved along his front line to better apprise himself of the situation on the right flank. During the course of action, a platoon leader was killed. Unhesitatingly, Captain Lunde moved through the bullet swept area to the platoon which was engaged in a victous firefight. With complete disregard for his safety, he moved among his men, inspiring them and rallying them to defend their positions. He then returned to the center platoon and began to skillfully direct friendly air strikes and artillery fire. While moving forward by fire and movement, he continued to adjust artillery fire until he was within twenty-five meters of the bursting radius of the exploding rounds. After assuring himself that all his forces were in position, Captain Lunde directed and led a coordinated assault on all fronts against a well disciplined and entrenched Viet Cong force. Through his heroic efforts, the insurgents were routed. His extraordinary heroism in close combat against a numerically superior Viet Cong force was in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflects great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army.
