## AWARD OF THE SILVEN STAR

1. TO 320. The following AWARD is amounced.

TAYLOR, THOMAS H. CAPTAIN INFANTRY United States army Co 8, 2d Bn (Abn), 502d Inf, 1st Ede, 101st Abn Div; APO 96347

Awarded: Silver Star

Date action: 6 February 1966

Theater: Republic of Wistman

Reason: For gallantry in action: Captain Taylor distinguished himself on 6 February 1966 while serving as commander of an aircome rifle company during a search and destroy mission at the village of Canh. Tinh, Republic of Vietnam, then elements of his company made contact with a large Viet Cong Force. Captain Paylor tembediately dispatched reinforcing elements and skillfully directed them into positions encircling the insurgent force. After assessing the battle from a helicopter over the insurgent positions, he rejoined his company. As he made several attempte to move through the open rice paddice to join his most beavily engaged clatoon; he was met by increasingly heavy fire Although he was unable to move or continued to direct his platoon leaders and the deployment of another element to reinforce his encirclement of the vallage. At Captain Taylor moved forward through intense lire, he personally carried one of his wounded troopers to the casualty collection point. When one of his comrades was fatally hit and fell into a swift running river, Captain Taylor recovered the body of his dead comrade. After rejoining his element, he led an assault on an insurgent position and captured a machine gun. He then directed his scattered elements in the sporadic lighting throughout the night. Through his courage and outstanding leadership, he contributed immeasurably to the decisive victory over the Viet Cong force. Captain Taylor's extraordinary heroism in close combat against a numerically superior hostile force was in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflects ereat crodit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army,
