Reason: For gallantry in action: Platoon Sergeant Hanna distinguished himself on 9 June 1966 during a search and destroy mission near Dak To, Republic of Vietnam. After evacuating a severe heat easualty through dense jungle terrain, Platoon Sergeant Hanna returned to the battalion command post. Without stopping for rest, he volunteered to return to his platoon which was located two kilometers away. Shortly after joining his unit, the platoon suddenly received intense hostile fire from a well-entrenched Viet Cong force. Although he was fully exposed to the Viet Cong fire, Flatoon Sergeant Hanna fearlessly moved to the head of the column in an effort to ascertain the situation. Observing that the Viet Cong had excellent fortified positions and Melds of fire, he immediately organized his platoon and directed fire and maneuver movements. When Platoon Sergeant Hanna personally led an assault to within Tifteen meters of a Viet Cong emplacement, his platoon leader was mortally wounded. Realizing the seriousness of the situation, Platoon Sergeant Hanna delivered suppressive fire onto the insurgent positions, killing one and wounding several others. While moving to the sid of a wounded commade, Platoon Sergeant Hanna was mortally wounded by Viet Cong fire. Through his courage and outstanding leadership, he contributed immeasurably to the eventual defeat of the Viet Cong force. Platoon Sergeant Harma's extraordinary heroism In close compat against a numerically superior hostile force was in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflects great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army.
