Awarded: Silver Star

Date action: 6 Petrusry 1966 Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For gallantry in action: Staff Sergeant May distinguished himself on 6 February 1966 while serving as a platoon sergeant during a reconmaissance operation near Tuy Hoa, Republic of Vietnam. While moving toward their objective, Staff Sergeant May's equal received intense hostile fire. Staff Sergeant May deployed his men and continued forward. As his squad advanced, two troopers were wounded. Staff Sergeant May immediately threw grenades at the hostile position, killing a Vist Cong. With complete disregard for his safety, he braved hostila firm while assisting a wounded comrade. Carrying the injured man, he moved across open rice paddies to an evacuation point. Undamnted by the What Corg fire, he returned to his squad and gave the order to withdraw. He than took one man with him to provide covering fire while he moved to the other wounded trooper and managed to extract him. Later, he led as element into the village of Canh Tinh. While entering the area, his squad was again subjected to hostile fire. During the course of action, Staff Sergeant May assaulted a house occupied by a Viet Cong spiper and killed him with a well-placed gransde. Moving to the rear of the house, he encountered another Viet Cong in a bunker. Unhestatingly Staff Sorgeant May pulled another grenade from his belt and threw it into the tunker, killing the insurgent. Staff Sergeant May's courageous actions inspired his men to successfully complete their mission. His extraordinary heroism in close combat against a numerically superior Viet Cong force was in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflects great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army.
