MOONTZ, LAUHENCE N PLATCON SERCEART M7 United States Army Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 2d Battalion (Airborne), 502d Infantry, AFO San Francisco 96347.

Avarded: Bilver Star (First Oak Leaf Cluster) Date action: .28 February 1966 to 1 March 1966

Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: Gallantzy in action: Platoon Sergeant Econtz, Platoon Sergeant of the "Recordo" platoon Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 2d. Battelion (Airborne), 5024 Infantry, was given the mission of securing a landing tone deep in Viet Cong infested jungle prior to a battalion size operation the following day. With a South Vietnamese Army plateon attached to his force late in the afternoon of 28 February 1966, Sergeant Koontz moved toward his objective 8000 meters away. After moving approximately 3000 meters, the two point squads end-. . . denly came under hostile fire. Sergeant Koontz quickly and expertly and sharps the two squads from the rear around the embattled front squads in an effort to out-flank the enemy. Shortly efter moving toward his new objective, his element came under a morderous hall of enemy fire. With his element and the point squads pinned down by sutomatic weapon and machine gon fire, Bargeant Koontz organized an assembt on the entranched enemy. When this failed and it became apparent that his whole force was surrounded, Sergeant Koontz grabbed en M60 machine gun and tried to infiltrate the enemy defenses. As he rose and ran for the tree line, he become the target of several enemy automatic wespons. Forced to crawl, Sergeant Koontz continued his daring assault and reached the enemy lines. His amountain expended, and the enemy regiouping for a charge, Sergeant Knontz then returned to his platoom. He again started out by himself, with a fresh load of ammunition, this time assemiting a weaker portion of the enemy defenses. His men, inspired to great heights by this extraordinary act of gallantry, rushed forward and overren the bewildered Viet Cong. Sergeant Koontz, not satisfied with simply freeing his platoon from enemy fire, pursued the fleeing, disorganized enemy. Still corrying the machine gun, Sergeant Koontz killed three Viet Cong who tried to make a last ditch stand egainst the inspired, aggressive paratroopers.

> " "After extraction of the wounded, the records plateon then reenganized and continued their mission toward the landing some .: Shortly before reaching the main objective. Sergeant Koontz inedvertently stepped on a purji stake. However, he told no one of his injury

and refused medical aid. As the recordo plateon approached the landing zone, it again come under hostile fire from a small group of buts. Sergeant Koonts braved the withering fire to position himself close enough to effectively call artillery fire on the determined enemy. After the artillery was lifted, he again personally led an assault on the Viet Cong. Although limping quite noticeably and obviously in great pain, Sergeant Koontz was able to overrun the enemy and thus secure the landing zone for the forth-coming assault. Through his untiring efforts and conspicuous callantry, the mission was accomplished, and the battalion was able to land without incident. Sergeant Koontz's avid professionalism and personal intrepidity was unparalleled. His actions are in keeping with the highest standards and traditions of the military service and reflect immeasurable credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Aimy.
