Reason: For callentry in action against a bootile force on 21 July 1967 near Doc Pho, Republic of Vietner. While on a everth and destroy mission, First Limitscapt Coops platons suddonly detected communications setivity to their front. Maving been presimuly alarted of a possible some battalion command post in the area, limiteness Trop decided to lead a small recommaissance element forward to investigate. Licutament forp led a seven pan recommissance e'esent through energ outposts and several times passed within sevenal meters of enough positions. When lieutenant foop and his smill element were within thirty meters of the amopeoted energy communed profit they were detected by energy gairds and immediately brought under a heavy volume of enemy fire. Liceterat Toop immodiately directed his recommissance elevent to return fire and secure & route of withdram, With semplete disregard for his own personal salety, Lieutenant Toop and his machinerumer assaulted the suspected enowy command post. Although twice knowled to the ground by enemy gremades, Lieutemant foop continand suspended in parametry willing two wants officers insido the commend post. Still under hostile fire, Lioutement Toop stripped the deal energy officers of credentials and documents and then led his one back to the main body of his platoon. Ligutonant foup then called for artillery and guranipe strikes on the enemy positions. It was later determined after a sweep of the area that ope of the enery officers Lieutenant Toop had killed had been a battalion orwearder.
