RAPPHILL, JUNEY R. , SECOND LIEUTENANT, INFANTRY, United States Army, Company A, 2d Rettalion (Airborne), 502 Infantry, let Brigade Molat Airborne Division APO 96347.

Amarded: Silver Star Date action: 15 May 1967 Theater: Especial of Vietnam

Rescon: For gallartry in action against a hostile force on 16 Kay 1967 nzer Duc Pho, Republic of Vietnam. Second Lieutenant Barnhill distinguished himself with heroic action while engaged on a search and destroy mission. The first platoon, Consany &, 2d Exttalion (Airborne), 502d Infantry came under a tremendous volwas of automatic and semi-automatic weapons fire from an estimabed Wist Cong platoon. Lieutemant Barnhill immediately noved to the front of his element and started maneuvering his element against the chemy positions. As the enemy fire increased, he realised that an enemy machine gun position had to be destroyed before he could effectively engage the enemy. With complete disregard for his own safety, Lieutenant Barnhill, with resolute determination jumped up, exposing himself to a hail of enemy firs and assaulted the machine gun position. His valiant effort silanced the machine gun position by killing the two enemy soldiers. As a result of Lieutement Barmhill's decisive and courageous actions, his plateon was able to overrun the enemy positions, routing the enemy who left behind nine dead and eight wespons. Lieutenant Barnhill's outstanding display of unquestionable valor in close combat is in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflects great credit upon himself, his unit, Task Force Oregon, and the United States ATTE.
