AWARD OF THE SILVER STAR

1. TC 320. The following AWARD is amnounced,

CARPENTER, JANZS H. , STAFF SERCEANT E6, United States Army, Company A. 2d Battelion (Airborne), 502d Infantry, 1st Brigade, 101st Airborne Division APO 96347

Awarded: Silver Star Date action: 29 May 1967 Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For gallantry in action against a hostile force on 29 May 1957, near Due Pho, Republic of Vietnam, Staff Sergeant Carpenter distinguished himself while leading his round down a trail in dense jungle folizge. An estimated enemy sound pinned down his aquad with intense fire. Realizing the need for decisive action, Sergeant Corporter, with complete disregard for his own safety, exposed himself to the maderous fire and assculted the enemy positions. In the ensuing descult, Sergeant Carpenter killed one energy soldier and, while still emposed to the hostile fire, pursued and captured another. His squad, inspired by his courage and daring, followed suct and assaulted the remaining positions routing the enemy who left behind three dead, three waspens, and one prisoner. Staff Sergeant Carpenter's unquestionable valor, resolutoress, and dauntless determination in close combat are in keeping with the finest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, Task Force Oregon, and the United States Army.
