## AMARD OF THE SILVER STAR

JURINSKY, JOHN 8411351857 STAFF SERGRANT To United States Army 2d Battalion (Airborne), 502d Infantry, APO San Francisco 96347.

Awarded: Silver Star

Date action: 2 October 1967 Theater: Republic of Victnam

Reason: Callertry in action: Staff Sergeent Jurinsky distinguished himself on 2 October 1967 while engaged is military operations involving conflict with an armed bostile force in the Republic of Vietnam while serving with Congress 1, 2d Schieling (Airborne), 502d Infantry, 1st Brigade, 101st Airberne Division. Sergeant Juringly's platoon was given the mission of assembling a Morth Vietnamese gray defensive perimeter. The North Vietnamess Army force was in well cazouflaged bunkared positions above Sargount Jurinsky's platoon, The plateon deployed on line with two aquads and began to move forward. Surgeant Jurinaly was initially with the third squad and in a reserve rear security position when suddenly the left flank squad was taken under on intense volume of enemy entountic weapons fire and became pinned down. The right flank sound began to nameuver, but became heavily engaged with automatic weapons and grenades. Sergeant Jurinely immediately deployed his squad, gathered grenades and essanition and rushed forward through the vicious chemy entomatic weapons fire. With complete disregard for his own safety, Sergoent Jurinsky rushed forward and threw three hand granades into the ensay bunker at a range of about ten meters. As the burst from the emploding granades went off, Sergeant Jurinsky personally assumited the enemy bucker and successfully killed the Forth Vietnamese Army soldier inside. He was then taken under heavy enemy entomatic wearons fire again and was hit by a Chi-Con granade that failed to explode. Sorgeant Juringly withdrev from his exposed position only after all the men had pulled back below the next terrace. Sergeant Jurinary singlehandedly broke a counter-attack by throwing grenades and firing his M-16. Surgeant Juringly covered the withdrayal of the other squads to positions where they could secure their dead and wounded and while under fire he helped carry them from their extremely exposed position. Sorgeaut Jurinsky's outstending display of gallentry in action and his devotion to duty are within the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit and the United States Army.
