Reason: For gallantry in action against a hostile force on 13 August 1967 meer Cor Ici, Republic of Victors. First Lieutenant Berry, a Platoon leader, was inserted with the rest of the company by airborne ascault onto a ontoletely here and mined militop. The onmany was not by a morth Pietnemee Any battalion which ismediately attacked with automatic weapons, heavy macrenesus, and mortars. Lieutement Berry, with complete disregard for his own personal safety, exposed timedif to the withering heil of enemy fire as he recovered wounded and personally positioned his men in the perimaker. During the remainder of the day and throughout the night, Lieutement Berry's platoen bore the bount of muncrous aroung attacks. Likeutemant Berry remained cool and caln throughout the batile, directing fire, adjusting satillary, and pinpointing targets. Puring the asseults, he moved from his position to position on the perimeter aumitionating his platooms fire with bis rifls end band grenades. When a particularly heavy mortar attack and a fellowing assault was launched, he adjusted artillers to within thirty maters of his position. Lighterant Berry's daring bravery, sound judgement, and active porticipation in the battle was instrumental in his company to ultimete victory over a meanically superior force. First Lieutament Berry's outstanding display of callantry and his devotion to duty are in beeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit unin himself, the Americal Division, and the United States Army.
