Awardos: Silver Star

Date action: 13 August 1967 Thester: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For gallantry in action against a hostile force on to August 1967 man Duc Fro, Republic of Victum. First Lieutenent Orrold, a plateen leader, was participating in an atroubile asoault made by his company. The landing tone was somed, and as the elatored began to move away from it, they were brought under murdarous small same, autocatic wasmans, and machinegun fire free a Morth Vistnamess Army battelion. One of the platoons was pinned down by the initial burst of fire, and suffered several cosmulties. With complete disregard for Ms own personal safety, Licutement Orwald personally led his alatoon into the interse enemy fire, relieved the pressure and allowed the platonn to recover its wounded and withdraw to a covered area. Identerant Orvold moved to within ten meters of the enemy's position, personally essculting the positions with hand gravedes and bursts from his rifle. His individual ageratsivoness and personal courage resulted in the death of four of the cheer, six the silencing of a machineswa and several other autometic weapons. As the platoon began to move back to the parienter, Lieutement Oryald abserved one of the wounded to Me front who was under fire from other enemy positions. Again, without regard for his own sefety, he behaved through the heavy suiter fire and recovered the wounded par. Dice in the parimeter, Ideutenant Orvold wived arong bis pusitions, directing fire and maintaining fire discipline. Throughout the night, which was filled with enery attempte to overrun the parimeter, lieutement Orsold constantly exposed purpolf to fire widle be rallied his mon, directed fire, and adjusted artillery. His persenal aggressiveness in battle and his superb leadership were instrumental in the ultimate idetory won by his company. First lighterent Oriold's upquestionable valor was in keeping with the highest traditions of the cilitary service and reflect great credit spon himself, the Americal Division, and the Drited States Ling.
