Reagon: For fallantry in action affinet a hostile force on 13 Algust 1967, near Clau Lai, Republic of Vietnem. Shortly after the last elements of Compare B. 2d Battalian (Airborne), 902d Infantry had reached a landing some, the point elatern was braught under a tresendous veltac of enemy automatic washings recket, and rifle grenade fire. As the intensity of the bettle increased it was necessary for the artillery forward observer to cell for artillery fire around the Parimeter. Realising that the forward observer would be upple to effectively adjust the artillery fire by himself, First Sergeant Buith, with complete thoremrd for his own safety, rushed throught the intense enony fire to an exposed position where he could assist in adjusting the fire. Ajmost immediately, First Scracent Geith was brought under aniler and granada fire and wooded. The regarding his wounds and his safety, First Seresant Smith remained in his exposed position and returned the eneur fire, willing three theny soldiers while he continued to relay information to the formard asserver and adjust artillory fire. During the later stages of the battle it was necessary to Ret three emergency exponition resupplies for the company. First Sergeant Smith impediately took charge of the distribution of the againstion and, on several occasions, personally carried ammunition to orme of the positions. When the nedical eractation helicolter was able to land, he paragraphy directed the evacuation of all the casualties. First Sergount Smith's outstancing display of Collantry in action and his devoting to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military acryice and reflect great credit upon himself, the Americal Division, and the United States Army.
