AMARD OF THE SILVER STAR

1. TC 320. The following AWARD is announced posthumously.

CAFTAIN, INFANTRY, United States Army, BOYD, RICHARD K. JR. Company B. 2d Battalion (Airborne), 502d Infantry, 1st Brigads, 101st Airborne Division APO 96347

Awarded: Silver Star

Uste action: 2 Gotober 1967 Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For gallantry in action against a hostile force on 2 October 1967 in the Republic of Wietnam. Captain Boyd distinguished himself by exceptionally valorous action while on a search and destroy mission when Company B, 2d Battalian (Airhorne), 502d Infantry became engaged with two energy companies in fortified positions. As the point platoon assaulted the initial energy hunker system, it was minned down. Captain Boyd directed that two relations move forward to assist the pinned down platoon. Personally leading the meneuvering force from the point element, he started across an exposed area and was immediately brought under intense automatic weapons, rifle, and rocket fire. Observing that two of his man had been seriously wounded and were lying in an exposed area of hostile fire, Captain Doyd immediately, and with complete disregard for his own safety, ruthed forward through the intense fire and pulled the men to safety. Captain Boyd then directed that one platean sive covering fire for the marauvering element in order to withdraw its casualties and disengage the enemy to allow supporting artillery fire to be called in. Ezzed by enemy rocket fire which wounded four, Captain Boyd regained his feet and, still exceed to the chang fire, moved among his men's positions giving them encommagament and directing their fire. Captain Boyd remained continuously exposed until his wormded had been removed to safety. The outstanding leadership and courage displayed by Oartain Boyd resulted in nine enemy dead and his pallantry while engaged in close combat with a numerically ougerior hostile force was in keeping with the finest traditions of the military service and reflects great credit upon himself, the Americal Division, and the United States Army.
