## AWARD OF THE SILVER STAR

JACKSON, ALEXANDER SURGEANT By, United States Army, Company 3, 2d Bettalion (Airborne), 502d Infantry, 1st Brigade, 101st Airborne Division APO 96947

Awarded: Silver Star

Date action: 13 August 1967 Theater: hepublic of Vietnam

Reason: For gallantry in action against a hostile force on 13 August 1967 in the Republic of Vietnam. Serfeest Jackson distinguished birself by exceptional valor and personal secrifice when his compress the brought under a determined attack by an ostilinated reinforced Morth Vietnemee battalion. The entry rapidly attempted to oversin the company by harling themselves at the perimeter. Sergeant Jackson's position was brought under the initial burst of fire and he was wounded in the chest by rocket fire. Realising that the perimeter was about to be penetrited, Sergeant Jackson, disregarding his wounds and exposing Maself to the enemy fire, caneuvered his aquad into a position where they could place effective fire on the enamy. Noticing three insurgents, one carrying a rocket launcher, approaching his equal's flank and realizing the preserious situation developing, Sergeent Jackson, with utter disregard for hie own safety, charged formerd through the murderous fire and Milled the three enemy soldiers with a band granade before the rocket leancher could be used. Soming a bender of his squad lying workfield outside the perimeter, he once again exposed bisself to the vicious fire and resized to the wounded chais aid. As Sergeant Jackson Filled the man to safety, he was mortally wounded. Sergeant Jackson's substanting display of ungreationable valor and dedication to duty in close combat against a minarically superior hostile force were in beeping with the finest traditions of the military service and reflected the greatest of eredit upon himself, Task Porce Oregon, and the United States Army.
