## AWARD OF THE SILVER STAR

1. TC 320. The following AWARD is announced posthumously.

HCBO, SDM/RD , SERCEANT ES, United States Army, Company B, 2d Battalion (Airborne), 502d Infantry, 1st Brigade, 101st Airborne Division APO 96317

Awarded: Silver Star Date action: 21 August 1967 Theater: Republic of Vietnes

Reason: For gallantry in action against a hostile force on 21 August 1957 in the Republic of Vietnam. Sergeant Bobo distinguished himself by exceptional valor and personal ascrifice While on a sourch and destroy mission as his squad came under intense energy automatic weapons fire from a fortified bunker. Sergeant Pobo immediately meneuvered his squad against the commy posivion. He led one clement of his squad and advanced to within sixty fact of the bunker; moving through machinegum fire, Sergeant Babo killed two of the incurgents. Once in position, he exposed himself to the enemy fire four times to throw as cany groundes. Mis grenades did not destroy the bunker. Roslim mirghat the momentum of the attack had to be maintained, Surgeant Bobo, with complete disregard for his own safety, leaped from his position and man through the intense hall of energy machinegum fire to a position which would afford him a close range on the bunker. While running, he was wounded by the fire. Once in position, however, he continued his determined attack on the bunker with hand grenades and destroyed the banker willing two wore of the ensury. Although wounded and still receiving fire, Sorgeant Bobo left his covered position to rejoin his squad for an assault on another bunker. While Inking his way back to the squad he was mortally wounded. Sergeant Bobo nover relented from his determined effort to resist and quall the energy by all menus available; his outotanding display of unquestionable valor in close combat was in keeping with the finest traditions of the military service and his reflected the greatest of credit upon himself, Task Force Oregon, and the United States Army.
