WILHELMI, HENRY J. JR. , SPECIALIST FOUR E4, United States Army, Company B, 2d Battalion (Airborne), 502d Infantry APO 96347 Awarded: Silver Star Date action: 10 June 1967 Theater: Republic of Vietnan For gallantry in action against an armed hostile energy on Reason: 10 June 1967 near Duc Pho, Republic of Vietnam. While on a search and destroy type mission near Duc Pho, Republic of Vietnan, Specialist Wilhelmi, along with an eight man reconnaissance element of the 3d Platoon, Company B, 2d Battalion (Airborne), 502d Infantry came under a tremendous volume of automatic weapons fire from entrenched enemy soldiers. is the intensity of the energy fire increased, several members of the reconnaissance element were wounded. Specialist Wilhelmi seeing his wounded comrades laying in an exposed area rushed through the withering fire with complete disregard for his own personal safety, and dragged the wounded comrade for thirty neters through the bullet swept area to safety. Though wounded now himself and bleeding profusely, Specialist Wilhelmi returned through the murderous energy fire and moved another wounded man, approximately twenty meters to safety. As he returned through the devastating energy fire for yet a third wounded conrade, Specialist Wilhelmi was struck down by the enemy fire and killed. Specialist Wilhelmi was instrumental in saving the lives of the two men he carried to safety and because the energy fire was concentrated on him, the rest of his element was able to maneuver to a safe defensive position. Specialist Wilhelm's outstanding display of gallantry in action and his devotion to duty are within the highest military tradition and reflect great credit upon hisself, his unit, and the United States Any.
