Reason: Gallantry in action: Staff Sergeant Scott distinguished himself by gallantry in action while engaged in military operations against an armed hostile force in the Republic of Vietnam on 16 November 1967, while serving as a member of Company E, 2d Battalion (Airborne), 502d Infantry, 1st Reigndo, 101st Airborne Fayinian. While

borne), 5024 Infantry, 1st Brigado, 101st Airborne Division. While conducting a search and destroy mission near Chu Lei, the point squad of Sorgeant Scott's plateon began receiving heavy automatic weapons fire and was pinned down in an open field. Observing this, Sorgeant Scott repeatedly exposed himself to the hail of fire in order to proporly position his run and direct their fire. Sucing that anall area fire alone was not sufficient to destroy the energy force, Sorgeant Scott, with complete disregard for his personal safety, noved to an extremely exposed position through the enemy fire to a point where he could call in and adjust friendly artillary upon the enemy position. The onemy realized that he was adjusting artillory fire upon their positions and storted concentrating their fire on his position. Disragarding their fire, Sergeant Scott continued to call for and adjust fire on the energy, inflicting new casualties. Surgeant Scott expected binself repostedly to the victous enemy fire until he was killed by a short artillery round. Surgeant Scatt's outstanding display of heroism and devotion to duty were in the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great oredit upon hinself, his unit, and the

United States Army.
