FEANE, JOHN M. FIRST LIBUTDIANT, INFARTRY, United States SITY, Company C, 2d Battalian (Airborge), 502d Infantry, 1st Brigade, 101st Airborne Division APO 96374

Awarded: Silver Star Date action 18 May 1967

Indatar: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For gallantry in action against a hostile force on 18 May 1967 neer Duc Pho, Republic of Vietnam. First Lieutement Wooms distinguished himself when given the mission to move his pletoon to an area where another platoon had become heavily engaged and eurrounded by an enemy olement. Heutement Keen quickly eranized his plateon and moved them approximately two thousand maters to the scene of the battle. From striving at the battle eree, Reutenant Kean, realisting that darkness was rapidly descending and that he must reach the baleagured platoon as soon as possible, quickly manauvered his platoon into position to assault the rear and both flanks of the enemy element. Lieutenant Reane, aware that maintaining strict control would be the key factor in the execution of a successful assault, directed lús platson not to open fire until fired upon. After having moved loss than one hundred meters, the platean was audderly brought under a withering hail of energy fire. With complete disregard for his own personal safety, Lieutenant Keene rushed through the hasvy enemy fire, giving his win encouragement and directing their fire by pointing out the mazzle flashes from enemy positions. Eleutement Keine lead and directed the assault into the enemy with such aggressivences, and hie men were so inspired by his courage, that the aboault element successfully overran the oncmy positions, forcing the enomy to hastily flee the battle area. First lieutenant Reanels outstanding gallantry, leader_ ship and devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon

himself, the Americal Mivision, and the United States Army.
