## AWAID OF THE SILVER STAR

CLIFFORD, I DERT A. , FIRST LIEUTERANT, INPANTRY, United States Army, Company C, 2d Battalion (Airborne), 502d Infantry, 1st Brigade, 101 at Airborne Division Aro 963A7

Awarded: Silver Star
Date action: 16 Kay 1967
Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For gallantry in action asainst a hostile force on 16 May 1967 mear Out Tho, Republic of Vietnas, First Lieutenant Clifford was assigned the mission of giving assistance to a beleagured patrol by extracting their pasualties and maintaining contact with the enemy until reinforcements could arrive. Upon arriving at the battle scene, Lieutenant Chifford immediataly made an evaluation of the situation and moneuvered his plateon into position in order to place suppressive fire into the enemy position. While placing his men into position, Lieutenant Clifford observed a weunded man who was laying in an area exposed to heavy enemy fire. On two different accapions, men were wounded attempting to pull the injured wan the eafety. Lishtenent Mifford directed his men to give him covering fire while he, with commute disregard for his wan personal safety, charged through the hallot swept area to where the wounded ran lay, picked hir up and carried him to a safe position and administered the medded medical aid. On macrous coossions, he expessed himself to the enemy fire while directing the fire of his platoon by pointing out enemy positions. Lieutemant Clifford then called for attillery and supporting fire in order to evacuate the wounded. During the evacuation Lieutenant Clifford and his platoon wate brought under a heavy volume of enemy automatic weapons fire, forcing the medical evacuation helicopter to take off before the wonded could be loaded. Immade istely, Lieutenant Clifford deployed part of his plateon and persenally directed their fire into the enemy positions. He remained ' exposed while directing the suppressive fire into the enemy posi tions until the casualties had all been evacuated. As a result of Lieutenant Clifford's courageous actions, the lives of Ownerous men were saved and his man inspired to such a degree that the miseion was successfully assorphished. First Lieutenant Clifford's extatanding display of gallantry in action and his devotion to taty are in losping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, the Americal Division and the United States Army.
