## AWARD OF THE SILVER STAR

BAGHZY, SYEZETT JR. , SPECIALIST FIVE E5, United States Army, Hozdquarters and Headquarters Company, 2d Battalion (Airborne, 502d

Infantry, let Brigade, 101st Airborne Division APO 76317

Awarded: Silver Star

Date action: 9 January 1967 Theater: Republic of Victnam

Reason: For gallantry in action against a hostile force on 9 January 1967, near Komtum, Republic of Wietnam. During the hours of darkness on that night, the Recommalssance Platoon had established an ambush position along a jumple trail when an estimated reinforced enemy squad was detected entering the killing some. When the ambush was triggered, four wen of the friendly element were wounded and remained in an exposed area. Upon receiving word that casualties had been inflicted on the friendly element. Specialist Five Bagley, with complete disregard for his own safety, moved through heavy enemy fire while attempting to locate his wounded contrades in the darkness. Locating the first wounded man, Specialist Dagley immediately administered the needed modical aid and pulled the man to a safe area. Specialist Ingley then continued to move through, the bullet- '. swept aron until he had located and treated the three remaining wounded men and had personally carried them to covered positions. On two occasions, Specialist Bagler drew fire from the enemy while using his flashlight in order to give the more seriously wounded emorgency medical trantment. One time, while using his flashlight to treat the wounded, Specialist Bagley was struck in the head by grenade fragments and waynded. Despite his wounds and the heavy enemy fire, Specialist Bagley continued to give medical treatment until all the wounded were safe. Specialist Five Hagley's outstanding display of gallantry in action and his devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, the Americal Division, and the United States Army.
