Reason: For callantry in action while entreed in military overations against an armed hostile force in the Republic of Vietnam on 17 November 1960. Cartain Vertz distinguished himself while serving as Company Commander of Commany C, 2d Battalion, 501st Infantry, on a combat operation near the village of Phu Loc, Republic of Vietnam. The commany, led by the First Platoon, was characted in a large sweet designed to drive insurgents from fortified positions. As it moved out, the Third Platoon came under heavy eveny fire. Captain Nertz immediately noved forward from his rear position to the lead element of the pletoon to assess the situation. After making his assessment, Captain Wertz amin moved through the heavy automatic weapons fire to the Third Platoon and personally directed its movement. Despite the heavy fire and with complete disregard for his own welfare, Cartain Wertz arain moved with the forward element of the platoon in order to effectively control the flanking attack on the energy. Through informants captured during the sweep, it was determined that an estimated battalion of North Vietnamese Resulars weited to ambus' the company. Because of the enemy's numerical superiority and erozimity, Cartain Wertz chose to withdraw in order to call in effective artillery fire. Cartain Mertz rersonally directed all elements of the company in an orderly withdrawal and, in spite of the heavy enemy fire, remained in place until assured that all cloments of his company had with raum. Certain Mertz's personal bravery and devotion to duty were in keeping with the him est traditions of the military service and reflect meat credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Arro-.
