AWARD OF THE SILVER STAR MEDAL

1. TC 320. The following AMARDS are announced.

Reason: For sallantm in action in the Republic of Vietnam on 22 March 1968.

First Lieutenant Foram intimumished himself while serving as commanding officer of Company D, 2d Rettalion, 50 st Infantry. Company D was asseulting a heavily fortified dual bunker system atop a high hill just west of Hue, Republic of Vietnam. The bunker system atop a high hill formidable, constructed with rock and natural materials, dried and hardened, and were able to support each other by direct fire. As the company closed on the enemy stronghold, First Lieutenant Hogan advanced to the front of his unit in order to determine the extent advanced to the front of his unit in order to determine the extent of the energ's defenses and the overall strength of the foe's position. As soon as he came within view, a fusillade of energy automatic wearons and machine run fire opened up on him, churning up the earth within inches of his position. First Lieutement Hogan immediately realized that no men could successfully storm this position without supporting fires. And so, fully exposing himself to the fierce energy onstruct in order to be certain of the resitions he was recording, First Lieutenert Hogan called in tactical air strikes and artillery fires. As these fires came raining in on the enemy, only a short distance from First Lieutenant Hogan's position, the officer bravely starged it his post so that he could determine the effectiveness of the friendly firenower. Then, the artillery and air strikes having subsided, he directed one of his platoons to storm the position. However, the enemy still held their ground tenaciously as a withering hail of bullets tore into the advancing platoon's ranks allowing it to so no further than First Lieutenant Hogan's forward position, altrough some individuals advanced to within ten meters of the enemy bunkers before being forced to withdraw. Once again, First Lieutenant Foran called in supporting fires from artillery units and fighter jets, and this time be crawled even closer to the enemy in an effort to assure the effectiveness of this fire. As the lethal weapons pounded the bunker positions, debris showered First lieutenent Hogan and shrappel flew over his head. Yet he remained, undaunted, as he directed these fires and then, as they lifted, called for two more platocns to storm the challenging citadel. As the paratroopers rushed up the hillside, the enemy opened fire once again with terrifying

up the hillside, the enemy opened fire once again with terrifying accuracy, and as they swarmed past First Lieutenant Hogan's position, the of icer stood bolt upright amidst the damage about him in a gallan effort to encourage the men onward. Despite intensified enemy fire from the binkers, further machine gun fire from the reverse slope, and enemy morter fire, the combination of heavy artillery and air power along with the tenacity and courage of First Lieutenant Hogan's men were able to overcome all resistance. Greatly inspired by the sheer audacity and calm courage of their commander, the infantrymen overran the enumy's positions, killing all the defenders. First Lieutenant Hogan's personal brevery and devotion to duty were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States winder the provisions of the Act of Congress established 9 July 1918.
