SEGEANT Headquarters and Headquarters LONG, ROMALD E Company 1st Battalion (Airborne) 502d Infantry APO San Francisco 96383

Awarded: The Silver Star Effective month: December 1968 Date action: 6 March 1968 Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For gallantry in action while engaged in military operations against an armed hostile force in the Republic of Vietnam on 6 March 1968. Sergeant long distinguished himself while serving as communications Sergeant on a combat operation in Thus Thien Province, Republic of Vietnam. On the morning of b March 1768, Company 9 made a combat assault near the village of Ap Mho Lam in search of a suspected North Vietnamese Army hospital. Upon entering the vilage, the company was engaged from three different directions by an enemy battalion with machine guns, rocket propelled granades, and mortars. The enemy fired from fortified and well-camouflaged bunkers. As essualties mounted, Sergeant Long aided in securing a landing some for medical evacuation, then returned to the battle. The First Plateon was engaged by nostile fire in a cemetery on the left flank and received heavy casualties from automatic weapons fire raking its positions. Evacuation of the dead and wounded necessitated crossing open rice paddies girestly in the enemy's field of fire. Fully conscious of this, Sergeant Long proceeded scross the rice paddies, crawling the greater part of the one hundred and flifty meters to the cametery. With disregard for his own safety, he dragged and carried the dead and wounded through heavy enemy fire to safety. By late afternoon, Sergeant long had personally carried six men from the field and continued to aid others despite low ammunition. Sergeant Long's personal bravery and devotion to duty were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon

numself, his unit, and the United States Army.
