For gallentry in action in the Republic of Wietnam on 21 May 1969. Lieuteners gafeer distinguisher hirself while serving as plateon leader, reconnaissance plateen, Company E, 1st Battalian (Airmobile), 50167 Takentry, suring a recommunissance in force operation near Tam Ey, in tuang Tir Province, Republic of Victors. Lieutenant Zapert valuateered to take his plateon and relieve Company D, which had sustained numbers oscualties while engaging a well-entrenched enemy force. While attempting to reach the company's location, Lieutenant Papert's plate of a thenly came under intense energy machine gun fire. baseting lammalitally, he should through the heavy fire and silenced the enemy position, killing the three-man crew and consuring the weapon. Utilizing a versi of his war in this position, he directed them to place suppressive fire upon the enemy as he and the remainder of his men went forward. Thile advancing on Company B's location, lieutenant Vaport was wounded by an enemy hand grenade, which temporarily impaired his vision and hearing. Ignoring his wounds, he subjected himself continually to the intense fire as he directed the evacuation of the dead and wounded. As he directed medical evacuation operations, he was again wounded in the leg by small arms fire. Quickly bandaging his wound, he evacuated the casualties to a secure area beyond the reach of energy fire. Only when all of the men had been treated and evacuated did he agree to leave the field of battle. his persenal bravery and dynamic leadership resulted in the killing of several enemy, the capturing of a large caliber enemy crew served weapon, and thesaving of many lives. Lieutenant Tapert's personal bravery and devotion to duty were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and

reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army.
