## AWARD OF THE SILVER STAR

SEROLAMT By United States Army HANTHORNE, CENE Co A, 2d Em (Abm), 502d Inf, 1st 8de, 101st Abm Div, AFO US Forces 963L7 Awarded: Silver Star

Date action: 9 December 1965 to 10 December 1965

Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For callantry in action: Sergeant Hawthorne distinguished himself from 9 December 1965 to 10 December 1965 while serving as patrol leader of a squad size element during a recommaissance odssion in "War Zone D", Republic of Vietram. After successfully infiltrating into Viet Cong territory, Sorgant Aswthorne's patrol was to remain in place until they were covered by the remard movement of friendly troops. Despite the skill and experience of the patrol, they were discovered after several hours and engaged by a Viet Cont platoon. Sergeant Hawthorne and his patrol immediately switched their K-16 rifles to automatic and repelled the attack. After two more encounters with the insurgent troops, Sorgeant Nawthorne was seriously wounded in both arms by fragments from a booby trap that killed one of his men. After unsuccessfully presunding his men to leave him behind, he directed his assistant in the formation of a defensive perfecter. Sergeant HANthorne continued to direct his assistant through two more vicious attempts to destroy the patrol. Realizing that his patrol had been cut down to three effective fighting men, Sergeant hawthorne demanded that he be placed in a firing position. Although he was only semi-conscious and could only see a few motors should, Sergeant Hawthorno, with complete disregard for his personal safety, held his position throughout the last assault and delivered deadly fire into the attacking Viet Cong. Surmoning the last of his strength, he pinpointed the patrol's position for an artillary battery, and helped his essistant adjust the incoming rounds by the sounds of the bursts. Through his courage and outstanding leadership, the insurgents were forced to withdraw, and a Viet Cong regimental base camp was discovered and subsequently destroyed. Sergeant Hawthorne's extraordinary beroism in close combat against a numerically superior hostile force was in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflects great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army.
