FAIRCLOTH, SOUNDE W. STAFF SERBMANT 3-6 United States Army

Awarded: Silver Star (Posthumusly) Date action: 18 September 1965 Theater: Republic of Victoria

Reason:

For gallantry in action: Staff Sergeant Faircloth distinguished himself by heroic action on 18 September 1965 while serving as a rifle squad leader in an airborne infantry battelion on 2 heliborne search and destroy operations, in the Republic of Vietnam, Almost immediately after landing, Sergeant Faircloth's elament was pinned down by enamy small arms fire. The unit received instructions to move forth to link up with the wain force approximately COO meters away. With enemy emiper fire coming from the west, and knowing the small unit was completely surrounded by enemy forces, Sergeant Maircloth, with complete disregard for his own porsonal safety, led the first element of the unit north. After moving approximately 20 meters, the element came under a heavy volution of small arms and anothing gun fire. Surgeant Faircleth was wounded and fell to the ground, signaling the other numbers of the element to return to the unit's positions. He refused to accept medical aid for himself knowing that it might result in another casualty. Surgeant faircloth was wounded several more times by enemy machine gun fire and died on the battle field. His fearlessness and genuine concern for his subordinates in the face of his own peril was an inspiration to the ontire unit. Staff Sergeant Faircloth's unimpeachable valor in close combat against numerically superior forces was in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his writ, and the United States Army.
