Date action: 12 December 1965 Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For gallcotry in action: Staff Sergoant Valasquez distinguished himsolf on 12 Docember 1965 while serving as a squad leader in an airborne infantry battalion on a soarch and destroy operation in den Cat, Republic of Vietnen. Sergoant Valasquez was assigned to the lead platoon of the battalion. At approximately 0915 hours made advancing through dome jungle terrain, one squed in the plateon came under Mrs from an estimated Vist Cong squad. Searing the initial burst of Airc, Sergeant Valasquez quickly moved his squad to the front to assist the squad umder fire. Upon reaching the area, the insurgent squad had slipped back into the jungle leaving several trails of blood, without hositation, Sorgount Valasques led Jour of his men along the trail of blood in relentless pursuit of the insurgents. As they stopped off the small trail, six Viet Cong opened fire from concealed positions with automatic warmens and hand granades. Sergoant Valuaques was wounded four times, but he quickly turned to his men and directed their fire on the insurgents. As the fire fight progressed, a grenade wounded him for the fifth time and he fell to the ground unconscious and shortly afterwards died of his wounds. Throughout the brist but forocione battle, Sergoant Valasquez placed the wellars of his mun and the accomplishment of the mission above his gersonal safety. His leadership, devotion to duty, and gallantage more an inspiration to his non. Sergoant Valasquez's gallant actions were in keeping with the highest traditions of the additary service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army.
